What is a proverb? First, what it is not - a proverb is not a promise or saying definitely guaranteeing the outcome that is being discussed (See MacArthur below). Second, proverb is the Hebrew word **mashal** which means comparison, similar, parallel. In short, a proverb is a figure of speech in which the author uses comparison in order to present a pithy, poignant observation or instruction. A proverb is a timeless truth in the form of a simple illustration that exposes a fundamental reality of life. Proverbs are practical (not theoretical), easy to memorize (Are you practicing the discipline of Biblical memorization?) and imminently applicable to real life situations.

Are the Proverbs guaranteed Promises? No. John MacArthur offers a good perspective: A final area of challenge comes in understanding that proverbs are divine guidelines and wise observations, i.e., teaching underlying principles (Pr 24:3, 4) which are not always inflexible laws or absolute promises. These expressions of general truth (cf. Pr 10:27; 22:4) generally do have "exceptions," due to the uncertainty of life and unpredictable behavior of fallen men. God does not guarantee uniform outcome or application for each proverb, but in studying them and applying them, one comes to contemplate the mind of God, His character, His attributes, His works, and His blessings. All of the treasures of wisdom and knowledge expressed in Proverbs are hidden in Christ (Col. 2:3).

MacArthur adds: The word "proverb" means "to be like," thus Proverbs is a book of comparisons between common, concrete images and life's most profound truths. Proverbs are simple, moral statements (or illustrations) that highlight and teach fundamental realities about life. Solomon sought God's wisdom (2Chr 1:8-12) and offered "pithy sayings" designed to make men contemplate 1) the fear of God and 2) living by His wisdom (Pr 1:7; 9:10). The sum of this wisdom is personified in the Lord Jesus Christ (1Cor. 1:30).

Wilkinson: Proverbs is the most intensely practical book in the Old Testament because it teaches skillful living in the multiple aspects of everyday life. Its specific precepts include instruction on wisdom and folly, the righteous and the wicked, the tongue, pride and humility, justice and vengeance, the family, laziness and work, poverty and wealth, friends and neighbors, love and lust, anger and strife, masters and servants, life and death. Proverbs touches upon every facet of human relationships, and its principles transcend the bounds of time and culture. (Talk thru the Bible)

Theme of Proverbs: The **fear of the LORD** is the beginning of **knowledge**. Fools despise **wisdom** and **instruction**. (Pr 1:7-note).

The **Septuagint** rendering amplifies the meaning of Pr 1:7-note - "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom (sophia); and there is good understanding (sunesis = "putting together the pieces") to all that practice it: and piety (eusebeia) toward God is the beginning of discernment (aisthesis); but the ungodly (asebes) will set at naught wisdom and instruction (paideia = "child training")." The Greek emphasizes wisdom instead of knowledge. Notice that "fools" are equated with the ungodly.

The **fear of the LORD** is the beginning of **wisdom**, and the **knowledge** of the Holy One is understanding. (Pr 9:10)

Note that this **fear** is not "shaking fear" but a reverential awe. It is like a child who fears disappointing their father or losing his approval and thus it is a "healthy" fear, good for our "spiritual health!"

Many of the Proverbs involve either a comparison or a contrast. Therefore, we include this special index concerning them.

COMPARISONS USING "AS":

"The tongue of the righteous is as choice silver" (Proverbs 10:20).

"The words of the whisperer are as dainty morsels, And they go down into the innermost parts" (Proverbs 18:8).

"The king's wrath is as the roaring of a lion" (Proverbs 19:12). "The king's... favor is a dew upon the grass" (Proverbs 19:12).

"The terror of a king is as the roaring of a lion: He that provoketh him to anger sinneth against his own life" (Proverbs 20:2).

"The king's heart is in the hand of Jehovah as the water-courses: He turneth it withsoever he will" (Proverbs 21:1).

"As an ear-ring of gold, and an ornament of fine gold, So is a wise reprove upon an obedient ear" (Proverbs 25:12).

"As the cold of snow in the time of harvest, So is a faithful messenger to them that send him; For he refresheth the soul of his masters" (Proverbs 25:13).

"As one that taketh off a garment in cold weather, and as vinegar upon soda, So is he that singeth songs to a heavy heart" (Proverbs 25:20).

"As cold waters to a thirsty soul, So is good news from a far country" (Proverbs 25:25).

"As a troubled fountain, and corrupted spring, So is a righteous man that giveth way before the wicked" (Proverbs 25:26).

"As snow in the summer, and as rain in harvest, So honor is not seemly for fool" (Proverbs 26:1).

"As the sparrow in her wandering, as the swallow in her flying, So the curse that is causeless alighteth not" (Proverbs 26:2).

"As one that bindeth a stone in a sling, So is he that giveth honor to a fool" (Proverbs 26:8).

"As a thorn that goeth up into the hand of a drunkard, So is a parable in the mouth of fools" (Proverbs 26:9).

"As an archer that woundeth all, So is he that hireth a fool and he that hireth them that pass by" (Proverbs 26:10).

"As a dog that returneth to his vomit, So is a fool that repeateth his folly" (Proverbs 26:11).

"As the door turneth upon its hinges, So doth the sluggard upon his bed" (Proverbs 26:14).

"As a madman who casteth firebrands, Arrows, and death, So is the man that deceiveth his neighbor, And saith, Am not I in sport?" (Proverbs 26:18,19).

"As coals are to hot embers, and wood to fire, So is a contentious man to inflame strife" (Proverbs 26:21).

"The words of a whisperer are as dainty morsels, And they go down into the innermost parts" (Proverbs 26:22).

"As a bird that wandereth from her nest, So is a man that wandereth from his place" (Proverbs 27:8).

"As in water face answereth to face, So the heart of man to man" (Proverbs 27:19).

"As a roaring lion, and raging bear, So is a wicked ruler over a poor people" (Proverbs 28:15).

COMPARISONS USING "SO" (not introduced by as)

"The north wind bringeth forth rain; So doth a backbiting tongue an angry countenance" (Proverbs 25:23). "It is not good to eat much honey; So for men to search out their own glory is grievous" (Proverbs 25:27). "The legs of the lame hang loose; So is a parable in the mouth of fools" (Proverbs 26:7).

"Oil and perfume rejoice the heart; So doth the sweetness of a man's friend that cometh of hearty counsel" (Proverbs 27:9).

"Iron sharpeneth iron; So a man sharpeneth the countenance of his friend" (Proverbs 27:17).

"The churning of milk bringeth forth butter, And the wringing of the nose bringeth forth blood; So the forcing of wrath bringeth forth strife" (Proverbs 30:33).

COMPARISONS USING "IS":

"The mouth of the righteous is a fountain of life" (Proverbs 10:11). "The righteous is an everlasting foundation" (Proverbs 10:25).

"He also that is slack in his work Is brother to him that is a destroyer" (Proverbs 18:9).

"The name of Jehovah is a strong tower; The righteous runneth into it, and is safe" (Proverbs 18:10).

"A man that beareth false witness against his neighbor Is a maul, and a sword, and a sharp arrow" (Proverbs 25:18).

COMPARISONS USING "LIKE":

"Counsel in the heart of a man is like deep water; But a man of understanding will draw it out" (Proverbs 20:5).

"A word fitly spoken Is like apples of gold in network of silver" (Proverbs 25:11).

"Confidence is an unfaithful man in time of trouble Is like a broken tooth and a foot out of joint" (Proverbs 25:19).

"He whose spirit is without restraint Is like a city that is broken down and without walls" (Proverbs 25:28).

"He that passeth by, and vexeth himself with strife belonging not to him, Is like one that taketh a dog by the ears" (Proverbs 26:17).

"Fervent lips and a wicked heart Are like an, earthen vessel overlaid with silver dross" (Proverbs 26:23).

"Better is a dinner of herbs, where love is, Than a stalled ox, and hatred therewith" (Proverbs 15:17).

"Better is a little, with righteousness, Than great revenues with injustice" (Proverbs 16:8).

"Better is the poor that walketh in his integrity Than he that is perverse in his lips and is a fool" (Proverbs 19:1).

"A poor man is better than a liar" (Proverbs 19:22).

"It is better to dwell in the corner of the housetop, Than with a contentious woman in a wide house" (Proverbs 21:9).

"It is better to dwell in a desert land, Than with a contentious and fretful woman" (Proverbs 21:19).

"Better is it that it be said unto thee, Come up hither, Than that thou shouldest be put lower in the presence of the prince" (Proverbs 25:7).

"It is better to dwell in the corner of the housetop, Than with a contentious woman in a wide house" (Proverbs 25:24).

"Better is open rebuke Than love that is hidden" (Proverbs 27:5).

"Better is a neighbor that is near than a brother far off" (Proverbs 27:10).

"Better is the poor that walketh in his integrity, Than he that is perverse in his 'ways, though he be rich" (Proverbs 28:6).

COMPARISONS USING "MORE THAN" OR "THAN":

"Wisdom... is more precious than rubies; And none of the things thou canst desire are to be compared unto her" (Proverbs 3:13-15).

"To get understanding is rather to be chosen than silver" (Proverbs 16:16).

"A rebuke entereth deeper into one that hath understanding 'Phan a hundred stripes into a fool" (Proverbs 17:10).

"A good name is rather to be chosen than great riches, And loving favor rather than silver and gold" (Proverbs 22:1).

"The sluggard is wiser in his own conceit Than seven men that can render a reason" (Proverbs 26:16).

"A stone is heavy, and the sand weighty; But a fool's vexation is heavier than they both" (Proverbs 27:3).

COMPARISONS USING "MUCH MORE":

"The righteous shall be recompensed in the earth; How much more the wicked and the sinner" (Proverbs 11:31).

"Sheol and Abaddon are before Jehovah; How much more then the hearts of the children of men!" (Proverbs 15:11).

"All the brethren of the poor do hate him: How much more do his friends go far from him!" (Proverbs 19:7).

"The sacrifice of the wicked is an abomination; How much more, when he bringeth it with a wicked mind" (Proverbs 21:27).

COMPARISONS USING "MUCH LESS":

"Excellent speech becometh not a fool; Much less do lying lips a prince" (Proverbs 17:7).

"Delicate living is not seemly for a fool; Much less for a servant to have rule over princes" (Proverbs 19:10).

Because there are so many contrasts in Proverbs, we only cite their references. Most of the contrasts are double contrasts (like Proverbs 13:33: (1) "curse" vs. "blessing" and (2) "wicked" vs. "righteous"), but there are some single contrasts and some triple.
